

- Absolute Colour Printing's InDesign knife cut templates contain a **'knife'**.
- The **'knife'** file has been set-up on the locked **'template'** layer of the InDesign file.
- Place your PDF file on the **'file'** layer and create a new PDF file. The new file will include the **'knife'**.

### Template Colour

- We have set all our **'knife'** lines in Pantone colour '072' and the swatch has been renamed **'knife'**.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** It is important that this remains unchanged.

### About the 'knife' file

- The 'knife' file on the 'template' layer is an indicator of where the job will cut. It will not print on your job.
- Please do not alter this file as it represents a pre-determined cut section.

### Bleed

Ensure that you have **3mm** (minimum) of bleed where any background colour/images extend past the trim edge.

### Ordering

**PLEASE** refer to the number that is on the PDF file name, so that we can match up that template with your print job. i.e.: BC2RC290x45mm.pdf
